ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:

Admission into Barry University is a process separate from the registration process and must be completed prior to course registration. It is the student's obligation to ensure that all admission credentials are received in a timely manner. Only official copies of transcripts from other colleges/universities will be accepted. One official transcript must be mailed directly from each issuing institution to Barry University, Office of Admissions, 11300 NE 2 Avenue, Miami Shores, Florida 33161.

Barry University does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, age, sex, national or ethnic origin, or physical limitations. This includes policies and procedures related to membership on the Board of Trustees, the educational program, employment and personnel practices, admissions, scholarship/grant/loan awards, and participation in athletic and other student activities.

CRITERIA FOR FULL ACCEPTANCE:

ACE has traditionally served adult learners. To qualify for portfolio credits, students must have a minimum of 5 years of full-time professional work experience and/or community service. The portfolio is mandatory or optional depending upon the degree selected.

- Interview with an academic advisor/director;
- Submit a completed application form with appropriate application fee;
- Provide one official transcript of credits taken at all colleges attended and, if applicable, CLEP, DANTES transcripts, or, if no college credit or fewer than 12 credits have been earned, provide one official transcript indicating graduation from high school or GED;
- Achieve a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or better in all previous academic work;
- Applicants holding an Associate Degree or its equivalent, present a minimum of 3 years of full-time professional work and/or community service experience past high school;
- Applicants not holding an Associate Degree or its equivalent, present a minimum of 5 years of full-time professional work and/or community service experience past high school.

CRITERIA FOR PROVISIONAL ACCEPTANCE:

Provisional acceptance is extended to those whose transcripts reflect less than a 2.0 cumulative GPA at the time of application. A student enrolling under this option is limited to twelve (12) credits in which a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 must be achieved at Barry University. Upon successful completion of twelve (12) credits with a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 at Barry University, full acceptance will be granted. Those who are unable to complete the admission requirements at the time of application are limited to twelve (12) credit hours at Barry University. The student must submit all required credentials before subsequent enrollment.

RE-ADMISSION:

Former adult education students who wish to re-enroll after a two (2) year absence from Barry University must re-apply and must fulfill new university requirements established during their absence.

Students must register by the start of the term in order to possibly be eligible for financial aid.

SEMESTER PAYMENT:

1. Any balance due from a prior semester must be paid in full before a student may register.
2. Registration MUST be accompanied by a check, money order or credit card number payable to BARRY UNIVERSITY. Credit cards that are accepted are Visa, American Express, and Mastercard.
3. Payment of tuition and fees is due in full within 10 business days of registering. Installment payment arrangements will be automatic with the company Tuition Management Systems (TMS) for any and all students that are not fully covered by financial aid (grants, scholarships and student loans) and do not pay in full.

CORPORATE REIMBURSEMENT DEFERRED PAYMENT PLAN POLICY

Students who participate in a corporate reimbursement plan are responsible for the entire tuition and fee charges regardless of their employer reimbursement policy, and these students must:

1. Present written documentation of employment from their employer at the time of every registration. The documentation should clearly indicate the level of corporate reimbursement (i.e., 50%, 75%, 100%, etc.)
2. Pay in full any difference between the total reimbursable amount and the tuition and fees.
3. Sign a Deferred Payment Plan form accepting responsibility for the entire amount of tuition and fees at the time of registration.
4. New students to Barry University who participate in corporate reimbursement plans are required during their first semester to comply with payment terms applicable to non-reimbursed students as explained in step #3.

TUITION REIMBURSEMENT BY VETERANS ADMINISTRATION:

Registration must be accompanied by payment as outlined in PAYMENT TERMS #2 and #3. It is the student's obligation to pay the University first and then seek reimbursement from the Veterans Administration. To avoid overpayments and/or interruption of benefits, it is absolutely necessary that the student notify the Financial Aid Office of any changes in status.

TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR SERVICE PERSONNEL:

The balance from the student must be paid at the time of registration as outlined in PAYMENT TERMS #2 and #3.

GUARANTEED STUDENT LOAN:

Registration from students with approved student loans will be processed. Students whose loans have not been approved at the time of registration must pay tuition and fees outlined in PAYMENT TERMS #2 and #3.

PELL GRANTS:

Any balance due after the awarding of the Pell Grant allowance must be paid by the student as outlined in PAYMENT TERMS #2 and #3.

HEALTH INSURANCE:

Health Insurance coverage is available for students taking six (6) or more credit hours. The Insurance Fee will be charged at the time of registration, if the student is not covered by a similar health insurance plan. It is the responsibility of the student to make sure insurance has been charged.

DROPPED COURSES:

Students who wish to change their registration status before the semester begins or during the first week of class must complete a Registration Adjustment Form with their academic advisor's signature. The refund policy is stated below.

Special course fees are not refundable. A student dismissed for academic or disciplinary reasons, at any time, shall not be entitled to any claim or credit.

TUITION REFUND POLICY:

Prior to the start of the semester 100%
Through the first week of classes 80%
After the first week of classes No Refund

DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS:

If a student's account shall become delinquent, the account may be referred to a collection agency, attorney, or both. In such an event, the student shall be liable for the balance due plus any fees of the collection agency, any attorney fees, court costs and all other charges associated with the collection of the debt together with interest at the maximum allowed by law.

No student may receive a diploma or transcript of credits until all financial obligations to the University are settled.

WITHDRAWALS:

Students who wish to change their registration status after the first week of class must complete a Withdrawal form or notify, in writing, their academic advisor. There is no refund after withdrawing from a course. An unauthorized withdrawal will result in a final grade of "F." Students must withdraw before the seventh Tuesday of the session. The date is published in the "Academic Calendar" in this schedule. The effective date of the withdrawal will be the date of formal notification to the School of Adult and Continuing Education.

GRADE REPORTS AND TUITION:

Grade reports are mailed to the student's permanent address. NO grades will be given over the phone.

REFUND REQUESTS AND CREDIT BALANCES:

ACE full-time students whose financial aid awards exceed their tuition and fee charges, generating a credit balance in their accounts, may not be eligible for an immediate refund of the excess balance.

If any of this credit balance is the result of federal or state financial aid grants (Federal Pell Grant, Florida Resident Access Grant or Florida Student Assistance Grant) please note:

- Any refund of these grants to the student cannot be processed until after all applicable add/drop periods have ended.
- Students who are enrolled in both sessions, Session A and Session B, may have access to their credit balances only after the end of the add/drop period of Session B.
- If, after the add/drop period of Session B, the student is still registered as a full-time student (12 credits or more) and continues to meet all other eligibility requirements, a refund may be requested.

Students who have received student loans, have a credit balance, and do not need the excess funds for educational related expenses should consider returning some of the credit balance to the lender to reduce their debt.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Every class is important, but none more so than the very first class. There is a limited amount of time during our accelerated semester to appropriately cover the subject matter. Coursework begins in earnest at the very first class. Special hints about how to proceed, statements about the biases of the discipline, clues about prioritizing your efforts, insights into the syllabus, grading policies, strategies for earning the grade you want, and much more, are addressed in the first class. These are things that cannot be summarized, will not be reliably conveyed in someone else's notes, and may not be revealed at another time in the course.

ENROLLMENT WITH OTHER INSTITUTIONS:

Once enrolled as a degree seeking candidate, a student will not be permitted to take courses at other institutions to apply toward the student's degree unless approved in advance, in writing, by the Associate Dean for Student Affairs.

REPEAT COURSE:

With prior written authorization, a student may repeat a course to improve the cumulative grade point average. If a student has an "F" and repeats the course and receives an "A", only the "A" counts. Quality points and credit attempted and earned on the second attempt are counted in place of those earned on the first attempt. Though both attempts remain part of the student's permanent record, the cumulative grade point average will reflect only the grade earned on the second attempt. Policy limits the number of times a course can be repeated.

CANCELLATION OF COURSE:

Listings appearing in the schedule are valid at the time of publication. Barry University reserves the right to add, delete, or change without notice any information pertaining to course offerings or locations published in the schedule. Barry University also reserves the right to cancel any class or section thereof, where enrollment is not sufficient. Full refunds are made when a class is canceled.

AUDIT:

Students wishing to audit a course must meet admission requirements and will be charged the regular per credit rate.

COURSE LIMIT:

The maximum course limit for School of Adult and Continuing Education students is twelve (12) credit hours per regular semester (six in Session A and six in Session B) and six (6) credit hours during the summer semester. To attempt more than the allowed credits in any given session requires the recommendation of an academic advisor and the written approval of the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs.

MANDATORY ENGLISH WRITING PLACEMENT AND MATHEMATICS SKILLS ASSESSMENT:

All students seeking a degree through the School of Adult and Continuing Education must take the English Writing Placement. Depending on the placement results, students must complete English 102 (College Writing for the Adult Learner), English 202 (Strategies for College Writing), and/or English 302 (Academic Writing and Research), with a grade of at least "C" beginning in either the first or second semester of enrollment. Each course may only be attempted twice. Additionally the Mathematics Skills Assessment must be taken by students who do not have college-level mathematics transfer credits accepted by Barry University and must be taken during the first semester (Session A and B) at Barry. Please be advised that you may schedule to attend an English and/or a Mathematics Placement date twice without penalty. If you do not attend either of the two placement dates you have scheduled, you will be required to schedule an individual placement date with a fee of \$25.00.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS:

The last thirty (30) credits and the majority of the major coursework must be completed at Barry University.

CHANGE OF PROGRAM:

To change degree programs within the same school, a request must be made, in writing, to an academic advisor/director.

INCOMPLETES:

Only in an emergency situation may a student request an incomplete "I" grade. It is the student's responsibility to arrange with the instructor for satisfactory completion of course requirements. An incomplete grade must be redeemed by the date published in the academic calendar which is the Friday of the eighth week of the next session following its receipt or the student will be automatically awarded a final grade of "F". The "I" grade and the redeemed letter grade both remain a part of the official transcript.

PROBATION/SUSPENSION:

1. A student is in good academic standing if the cumulative grade point average (GPA) is 2.0 or above.
2. A student is on probation if the cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0. A student on academic probation may not register for more than six (6) credit hours (three (3) hours per session) and is ineligible to register for a tutorial/independent study course.
3. A student on probation who is unable to earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 after having attempted twelve (12) credit hours at Barry University will be suspended permanently from the School of Adult and Continuing Education.

SEMESTER PAPERS:

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that instructors receive all coursework directly. Coursework will not be forwarded to any instructor from either the Miami Office or any of the off-campus offices.

GRADUATION AND APPLICATION FOR DEGREE COMPLETION:

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that graduation requirements are met prior to application for graduation. Students must apply for graduation prior to the beginning of their final semester of enrollment. Deadlines appear in this schedule. Graduation forms are available from the Miami Office or any off-campus office. Applications are to be completed, signed by an academic advisor or director, and submitted to the Miami Office. A student who receives an incomplete grade "I" during the semester of graduation will not qualify for graduation and must re-apply for the next graduation date. For students who were admitted fall semester, 2002 and thereafter, computer proficiency is a degree requirement. Students admitted fall semester, 2002 and thereafter, who are seeking a Bachelor of Science in Legal Studies degree and a Bachelor of Liberal Studies degree with a specialization in Legal Studies must take the Certified Legal Assistant (CLA) examination prior to submitting an application for degree completion.

GRADUATION CEREMONY:

The commencement ceremony for Barry University will be held on Saturday, May 8, 2010. Students who have completed their degree programs are eligible to participate. **See Page 1.** See the director or academic advisor at your site for information on cap and gown orders.

GRADUATING WITH HONORS:

In order to qualify for graduation with distinction, a student must have taken a minimum of 56 credit hours at Barry University carrying letter grades of "A", "B", "C", or "D" and must have maintained a grade point average of 3.5 or above. This does not include transfer credits from other schools, Portfolio credits, CLEP, test-out credits or courses graded credit/no-credit. Only courses taken at Barry are computed in determining honors. The GPA will be rounded to the third decimal place.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The following notice is a summary of the rights of students under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) also known as the "Buckley Amendment." Additional information regarding FERPA is available in the University student handbook.

RIGHTS:**1. Review and Inspection of Records**

Students have the right to review and inspect their educational records as defined in Section VII of the Policy within a reasonable time of a request to the custodian of those records. All requests to inspect records will be fulfilled within 45 days. The University has an obligation to respond to reasonable requests from students for explanation of their education records. If the student is unable to inspect personally his or her education record, the University is obligated to provide a copy of the record requested upon payment of a copying fee.

2. Right to Request an Amendment of Records

A student has the right to request that the University amend education records which the student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of the privacy or other rights of the student. The University will decide whether or not to amend such records and so inform the student.

3. Right to a Hearing to Challenge the Contents of Records

A student has the right to a hearing to challenge the contents of education records the student believes are inaccurate, misleading or in violation of the privacy or other rights of the student. The hearing is conducted by the Vice President for Academic Affairs. If the student prevails at the hearing, the student has the right to request an amendment to the record. Should the student not prevail, the student may enter an explanation in the records setting forth any reason(s) for disagreeing with the hearing decision.

4. Right to Refuse Designation of Directory Information

At its discretion, Barry University may provide directory information in accordance with the provisions of the Act to include: name, address and telephone number, date and place of birth, photograph or likeness, electronic e-mail address, major field of study, grade level (undergraduate/graduate), enrollment status (full-time or part-time), dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams.

Students may withhold directory information by notifying the Registrar in writing no later than the 15th day of the academic semester (or the 5th day of a summer session). Requests for non-disclosure will remain in effect until the student informs the Registrar in writing to remove the block to designation and disclosure. The student may send correspondence to:

5. Right to File a Complaint

Complaints regarding violations of the rights accorded students under this policy should be directed to the Vice President for Student Services. Complaints failing resolution internally may be filed directly with the Department of Education, 330 Independence Avenue, Washington, D.C. 20201.

Students who intend to submit a portfolio are expected to attend a Portfolio Seminar the first or second semester of their enrollment. It is advisable that portfolios be submitted within one year of Portfolio Seminar attendance. Portfolios must be submitted at least two semesters prior to intended degree completion date. Textbooks for classes listed for Dade County may be purchased at Follett Barry Bookstore.
