Job placement for both internships and full time/part time permanent placement occurred in a number of areas. Most students (85%) found local placement, which is considered to be within a 50-mile radius of Miami. A portion of students (7%) have been placed in other cities in Florida, especially Orlando, Tallahassee, and Tampa. Students are not limited to the state of Florida, in fact, 6% of students were placed nationally in major cities such as Houston, Texas, New York City, NY, and Washington D.C. to name a few. 2% of the students were placed internationally.
