

Sean Daniel Foreman was born and raised in Greensburg, Pennsylvania, about 30 miles east of Pittsburgh. He attended Clarion University of Pennsylvania where he earned a B.A. degree in Political Science with a minor in History in 1993.

Dr. Foreman moved to Miami to pursue his graduate studies at Florida International University (FIU). He earned an M.A. in International Studies with a concentration in Latin American Studies while also serving as a teaching and research assistant.

After a brief stint as a newspaper reporter, editor, and photographer for the South Dade News Leader, based in Homestead, FL, he returned to FIU to pursue his doctorate.

In 2003, Dr. Foreman completed his Ph.D. Incidentally, he was the first person to be granted a doctoral degree in Political Science from FIU. His dissertation, titled "The Politics of Professional Sports Facility Subsidies in Florida," focused on the coalitions formed by public and private leaders to secure government subsidies for sports stadium and arena projects in the Miami-Dade and Tampa-Hillsborough regions.

His teaching areas of concentration include American Politics, International Politics, and Comparative Politics. Dr. Foreman has taught various courses including American Government, State and Local Government, Public Administration, Political Theory I and II, and The Presidency at Barry. He has also taught courses on International Relations and Latin American Politics at the University of Miami and St. Thomas University, and on American Politics at FIU, Broward Community College, and Miami-Dade College, where he has also instructed online courses.

Dr. Foreman's research interests include the politics and economics of sports, local government structures, and electoral reforms.

When not teaching, researching, or reading about politics, Dr. Foreman likes to go to the gym and to ride his bicycle. He also enjoys going to the beach, traveling, and watching sports. His parents and brother, who is a newspaper reporter, still live in Pennsylvania.
