

## SCHOLARSHIPS AT BARRY LAW

There are two ways to achieve a merit based scholarship at Barry Law.

1. DURING THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS--Some students are eligible for merit-based awards based on both the undergraduate GPA and the LSAT score. These students must maintain a particular law GPA of 2.6 to 3.0 to maintain the award. *For example, the scholarships range from a 149 LSAT, 2.8 GPA and up. The lowest scholarship at 149 LSAT/2.8 UGPA is \$5000. The highest is 161/3.5 and up at \$23,000. A mid-range offer at a 155 LSAT/3.5 UGPA is \$15,000.*
2. DURING LAW SCHOOL--After the first year of law school is completed and grades are in, law students may be eligible for a merit-based scholarship based on academic performance during the first year of law school. (Students do not need to submit an application for these awards.)
  - a. Students in the top ten percent of the class will receive a 75 percent scholarship—also known as the Top Ten Percent Bonus Program.
  - b. Students who achieve competitive grades after the first year but who are not in the Top Ten Percent are also eligible for scholarship awards. These awards are based on law grade point average. Students who achieve at least a 2.75 law GPA or higher would be considered for merit-based awards based on available funds. (For example, a student just this past year with a 3.0 law GPA received an \$8000 award. These amounts are based on the pool of available funds each year.)
