FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION—FALL 2006

IMPORTANT: Fall 2006 tuition and all prior balances with the University must be paid, or satisfactory payment arrangements must be made, by August 23, 2006 to avoid being charged a late tuition payment fee of \$100.

Fall 2006 tuition is \$13,780.00 for 13 – 16 credit hours; \$10,388.00 for 8 – 12 credit hours; and \$975.00 per credit hour for less than 8 credit hours or for the number of credit hours over 16.

FALL 2006 GRADUATION FEE IS \$250.

Note: A student must take a minimum of five (5) semester hours to be eligible for student loans.

Satisfactory payment/satisfactory payment arrangements means:

- If paying by cash or check: In person, pay by August 23, 2006 by mail, post-marked no later than August 23, 2006.
- If paying by credit card: Visa, Master Card, or American Express by August 23, 2006.
- If using the Monthly Payment Plan:* Sign and submit by August 23, 2006.
- If paying by a student loan: Be sure to meet all published Financial Aid Deadlines.

***If you do not meet the established tuition payment deadline,
a \$100 late payment fee will be charged.***

*A Monthly Payment Plan will allow you to spread your tuition payment over five months during the Fall term. A fee of \$75 will be charged. See Carol Gibson, Student Accounts, Law Center Room 104, or Avis Benoit, Student Financial Services, Law Center Room 111, for assistance by August, 23, 2006.

If you have not filed a 2006-2007 FAFSA, you must do so by April 15, 2006, in order to provide ample time for the federal processor to send your loan eligibility information to us in a timely manner. You must also provide additional documents/information as soon as it is requested.
