

**Getting Started:** (2URLs + 1 number)

Use this URL <http://access.barry.edu>, or <http://ezproxy.barry.edu> to access resources. Log in and select "Library Web". Use the <http://webmail.barry.edu> toolbar for IT Support problems, or call (305) 899-3604, ext. # 4.

Catalogs: Compare the uses of **BLISSWeb**, **SEFLIN** and **World Cat**. Use a *title* search for "School Law". Try a keyword search for the school and law. Use instead the subject heading phrase "Educational Law and Legislation". How does the *subject* search help in expanding or narrowing a topic? Find the link for subheading, "cases". Click on that, then on "Extended Display".

Call Numbers: Library of Congress call numbers are a combination of letters and numbers used to provide a "shelf address" for each book. The letters **LA**, **LB** and **LC** are used for areas of Education; **K** is used for Law. What is the title for the book: **KF4118 .L25 1996**?

Databases: Select **Article Databases** sorted by "**Subject**" or "**Title**".

Those especially for law are **Lexis-Nexis Academic Universe** and **WestLaw Campus**.

- Use "**Database Tutorials**" for a detailed explanation of **Lexis-Nexis case law** searches.
- In **WestLaw Campus** use "**Help - FAQs**", (Frequently Asked Questions) for a step by step linked guide to its various search methods.
