Rev. Bryan N. Massingale, STD, is president-elect of the Catholic Theological Society of America and an associate professor of theological ethics at Marquette University in Milwaukee. He also serves as a theological consultant to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, has written many articles and essays, and is completing a book on racial injustice. His other work applies Catholic social thought to issues such as affirmative action, environmental justice, HIV/AIDS stigma, racism post-Hurricane Katrina, and peacemaking in an age of terrorism. An ordained priest, he earned his bachelor's at Marquette, Master of Divinity at St. Francis Seminary, graduate degree in moral theology at The Catholic University of America, and Doctor of Moral Theology at the Pontifical Institute for Moral Theology in Rome.
