Does the Availability of Reentry Services in Florida Counties Lower Recidivism Rates?

Introduction

Recidivism is a broad term defining the tendency of re-offense after one is released from incarceration. In Florida, the Department of Corrections defines recidivism as the return to a corrections facility within three years of release. Recidivism rates reflect the performance of counties' prison systems, reentry services, and support within the communities. The rates can represent the effectiveness of rehabilitation and re-integration processes. Reentry services such as housing assistance, job training or hiring groups, mental health treatment, counseling, and food services all contribute to breaking down barriers that one may face after release.

The Order of Malta was founded as a humanitarian organization that has a global mission to provide aid and care for marginalized, or vulnerable members of society. The organization is guided by medical, social, and humanitarian projects around the world. In Florida counties, The Order of Malta supports incarcerated individuals with reentry after release. They strive to improve housing, employment, education, religion, and health among all individuals that are released from correctional facilities to give them all necessary resources for pure success.

Given the Order of Malta's mission to support reentry, this study will examine whether the availability of reentry services in Florida counties correlate with lower recidivism rates, the fundamental research question being: Does the availability of reentry services in Florida correlate with lower recidivism rates? While Miami-Dade and Broward were the main points of focus, data has been pulled for all counties in Florida to investigate the correspondence state-wide. Research consistently shows that when individuals are given access to reintegration resources, they are less likely to reoffend; thus, leading to lower recidivism rates for their community.

For this research, the independent variable is the number and availability of reentry service resources within a Florida county. This was measured through a dataset merged with student-submitted service lists from Barry University and a preformed document, *Order of Malta Offender Resource Database*. The dependent variable within the research is the county level recidivism rate within three years of release, drawn from the Florida Commission on Offender Review's 2019 release cohort data. County population, crime trends, age, and type of services will be representing control variables. Supervision policy and enforcement can drive custody returns independent of services; therefore, revocations or warrants are considered a part of study context.

Understanding how the service availability and recidivism rates can impact policy decisions, community success, and more cohesive infrastructures can positively impact society entirely. The aim of this study is to influence county willingness to support released offenders and aid them in the transition back into functional society.

Literature Review and Theory

Many studies have explored the connection between reentry programs and recidivism, providing a baseline understanding to contribute to this study. In 2025, Cholupis and Kontompasi examined the correlation between prison and vocational training, ultimately leading to recidivism rates in the article, *Examining the Relation Between Education, Recidivism, & Crime Prevention*. They studied educational programs in which aimed to develop social skills, form strong self-identity, aid in society reintegration, reduce societal cost, and lowered expectation of recidivism within incarcerated individuals. The authors used both quantitative and qualitative data from studies around the world to apply a Risk-Need-Responsivity model as assessment to the effectiveness of the programs. Their findings emphasized the importance of creating programs within prisons that are directly tailored to every individual, whether strength or weakness.

In 2016, Greenwald and Widdowson, published *Predicting Recidivism Among Released Juvenile Offenders in Florida Journal of Offender Rehabilitation*. This article explored the effectiveness of R-Pact, Residential Positive Achievement Change Tool. It is used to predict recidivism variables in juvenile offenders within Florida correctional facilities. The results of their study showed that predictive validity within can be used to investigate dynamic changes in youth during incarceration. The authors measured the changes by viewing school engagement, vocational readiness, and relationships with peers. Using longitudinal quantitative data and longitudinal research designs to analyze over nine thousand juveniles with administrative data. *Recidivism of Public and Private State Prison Inmates in Florida*, authored by Bales, Bedard, Quinn, Ensley, and Holley in 2005 explored the recidivism rates among the two different types of prison, public and private. The goal was to find evidence that one carried lower recidivism rates than the other, due to funding and inside resources. Society carries opinions that private institutions have lower recidivism rates due to private and heavy funding; however, there were no significant differences between the two. The authors used a quasi-experimental design on more than 100,000 inmates in the years 1996 and 2001. They used age, criminal history, and offense as control variables. While the research is dated, it provides a framework for the current day with the same results.

Langenberger and Lipsey in 2005, conducted a meta-analysis of fifty-eight different adult offender studies. Their focus lay within those convicted of violent crimes. Their study showed that on average there was a 25% reduction rate on recidivism within inmates who participated in cognitive-behavioral therapy during their time incarcerated, compared to those who did not participate. The therapy used specific, targeted techniques that re-regulated emotion and cognitive reconstructing. Follow-up assessments were conducted after three years of release and confirmed the lasting effects on the individuals. This study showed the impact of reentry services, whether introduced within the facility or after. Psychological and behavioral intervention can be key to rerouting intention and mental stability for after release.

Together, the four studies demonstrate the consistency of lowering recidivism when interventions are included. Vocational and educational programs, both inside of correctional

facilities and after release, impact reentry back into society. To combat any idea that the type of facility may influence the reentry success, Bales et al. proved that private and public do not show impact on recidivism. This highlights that the content in programs and individualized based support contribute far more than facility type. The findings strongly align with deterrence theory, which suggests that programs with meaning do not promote future offense. As well, social learning theory can be identified within the literature. This theory emphasizes the importance of educational and societal based models that reshape behavior and self-identification. The grounds of this study investigate the key factors of recidivism. It provides evidence that interventions both challenge and encourage successful factors which are essential for reintegration after imprisonment.

Research Methodology

Sample

The population for this study consists of Florida-based, previously incarcerated individuals. While there is specific focus in the Miami-Dade and Broward counties, all counties have been represented. The focus stems from the large populations and extensive variety of reentry programs that are provided post-incarceration. The sampling procedure relies on secondary data analysis from offender reports by the Florida Commission on Offender Review and the Florida Department of Corrections. To aid in the analysis, the Order of Malta has provided an extensive guidebook highlighting many of the offered resources for reentry in each Florida county. The services were obtained through student research in which they were tasked with finding beneficial programs that can be resourceful for someone recently released from incarceration. The datasets include information on employment opportunities, vocational training, counseling services, food services, clothing resources, and informational resources for day-to-day living. The final sample will serve as a comparison between counties with different levels of resources and availability.

Research Ethics

This study relies on no direct recruitment of individuals, so there is no direct risk of human subjects. Ethical considerations are neutral within the study and at no point was confidentiality at risk or known. Using the offender records, confidentiality was already ensured, and public information. This study strictly abides by all ethical guidelines and aims to highlight the barriers and resources individuals face and can use after incarceration. As well, this study aims to provide guidance and support to all individuals facing reentry to society and has no intent to label or harm anyone from incarceration or reintegration processes.

Methods

This project uses secondary data as the primary method. Data was extracted from the Order of Malta guidebook, the Florida Department of Corrections, and the Florida Commission on

Offender Review. The recidivism reports were pulled from the Florida Commission on Offender Review and the resources were pulled from the Order of Malta resource guide. The County-level resource availability acts as the independent variable, while the recidivism rates from the counties act as the dependent variable. As well, the control variables will be the age or gender of the released individuals and the type of facility whether public or private. Examination of the counties will be mentioned in the analysis as the greater number of available resources for re-entry contributes to lower levels of recidivism. Strong validity is pulled from the official state data and reliability is strongly supported by cross-examination of the databases.

Analysis

The data will be analyzed between the county-level comparisons using comparative and descriptive methods. First, a spreadsheet is created cataloging the amount of services provided within each county of Florida. Second, the recidivism rates will be analyzed to see the levels within each county. Comparing the two datasets will provide a complex explanation as to correlation between the two.

A correlational analysis tests if the availability of resources is at all associated with lower recidivism rates. Miami-Dade and Broward show the highest resources available, which will serve as a point of comparison against small counties, with fewer services. Statistical procedures will include the qualitative student submission trends and controlled regression analysis of prison facility type and population.

When combining the quantitative and qualitative data approaches, the analysis will provide a comprehensive picture that shows the outcome of resource availability. The dual strategy will also show validity and reliability.

Timeline

The first four weeks of data collection consisted of compiling all student entries, as well as the already provided services within the Order of Malta guidebook. Using a spreadsheet, all student submissions were organized by county and type of service--clothing, food, employment, mental health counseling, or housing aid. The spreadsheet created a visual comparison of 121 found resources among Florida.

The following four weeks consisted of finalizing the resource data, ensuring accuracy among the resources, and implementing them into the pre-existing Order of Malta. As well, making sure the Order of Malta remained eligible and accurate in small detail as it will be used as a resource for reentry programs. Further, the then finalized guidebook was used to identify patterns and absences of programs within each county. It was crucial to make note of every missing program within each county to aid in the comparative analysis. Comparing the counties that held higher availability with the counties that lacked variety would become crucial for the final findings.

The final four weeks consisted of correlation models and strength of relationship between resource availability and recidivism rates. Integration of control variables and dissection of quantitative data was essential. The results were drafted, and a visual model was created to achieve a stronger answer to the study. Within the final four weeks, two of the weeks consisted

purely on ensuring validity and accuracy, as well as developing a comprehensive research analysis to present the findings.

Discussion

This study's findings reinforce much of what the literature already implies, structural resources offer a more decisive role in recidivism outcomes than individual characteristics alone. The analysis of student submissions at the county level and the Order of Malta offered firsthand support for this conclusion. According to the Florida Commission on Offender Review, Florida has overall had a three-year recidivism rate of 21.2% from inmates released in 2019 (*Florida Commission on Offender Review*, 2023). Broward County represented a three-year recidivism rate of 16.8% (Florida DOC, 2019). Broward County reported reincarceration reductions of 4-6% since 2019, while also carrying some of the highest varieties of resources for reentry. Broward, just within this research, offers about fifty resources for released individuals to access for free, which could explain their recidivism statistics. To show comparison, Alachua County within this research offers about four reentry resources. Not only does Alachua County show a higher incarceration rate, about three per one-thousand population. Florida as a whole shows incarceration at an average 2.5 per one thousand. In 2019, Alachua County reported a 26.9% recidivism rate, being 42.4% higher than Broward's 16.8% and surpassing Florida as a standing of 21.2% (Florida Department of Corrections, 2024). The difference is significant both in absolute percentage points and relative terms, reflecting the real disparities in two counties. In conclusion, Broward's lower recidivism is consistent with the wider range of services, while Alachua's higher recidivism rate is consistent with their lack of services.

To further strengthen this theory, Miami-Dade County had a recidivism rate of 19.9% in 2023, based on 2019 released individuals. In this research, there are about forty-five services offered such as Camillus House, Miami-Dade Homeless Trust, and a plethora more. Miami-Dade has one of the largest varieties of networks for reentry in the state of Florida. Baker County reports a 27.8% recidivism in Florida. According to the resources gathered, there are no reported reliable services provided. Baker County shows almost ten percent higher than Miami-Dade, and the fifth highest percentage for recidivism in three years for 2019, three-year release individuals (Florida Department of Corrections, 2024). This vividly shows the picture in which this study is trying to paint, that higher recidivism rates are found within counties that do not have easily accessible reentry programs. They may also not promote said resources enough to be effectively accessed.

Florida overall has decreased their recidivism rates since 2009 from 26.2% to 21.2% in 2019 (Florida Department of Corrections, 2024). Using this difference and the county differences, we can follow county variations versus statewide trends. This allows for easier explanation for recidivism rates. A main key to these recidivism rates lowering are the housing, employment, counseling, and food services that the Order of Malta easily guides access to. Per the organization, they also run a pen-pal program within correctional facilities that show a recidivism reduction of less than one in thirty, versus a national average of one in three (Order of Malta American Association, 2025). They provide services of ministry and counseling across fifteen states aiming to reduce recidivism.

Conclusion

This study demonstrates how recidivism is not based on individual behavior, but on the broader aspect of communal support. It emphasizes the importance of support structures within communities, aid to all, and especially aid to those who need it most. Sometimes those who are released from prison are those who need it most. The county-level data from the student research, Order of Malta, and Florida offender reviews combined show that the counties with more accessible and comprehensive services report lower recidivism levels. Using withstanding research on recidivism and differing facility factors aid to abolish stereotypes and theories, and strengthen the idea that communities hold much power. Educational programs, vocational training, housing aid, clothing drives, food services, and mental health counseling can boost the path of reentry for anyone released. By using this data, mixed with social learning theories, there is a highlighted need to expand within societal infrastructures.

For the future, there should be investment to obtain and provide a variety of services across the state of Florida for those facing a new path back into society. Financial burdens should no longer be a concern, and support should be guaranteed upon release from the county. It is critical that all counties provide multiple services if recidivism is wanted to continue decreasing. This move will ensure a lasting change within the Florida state justice system. Recidivism is a major indicator of effectiveness within the criminal justice system. It can be a measure to how well the correctional facility prepares those for release, but also how strong the community-based support works. High recidivism rates impact socially, financially, and emotionally within communities. There can be cycles without end of incarceration without target services to expedite success and protection. It is a crucial social measure that needs addressed and more needs implemented to find higher success and unity within communities. The results of this study support the hypothesis that greater availability of reentry services will correlate lower recidivism rates in Florida counties.

Services: Multiple, including food pantry and discount groceries for the needy, clothing, faith-based job training, job search help, GED classes, rent and utilities assistance, replacement identification, dental and vision clinics, medical advice and referrals, therapy and counseling.

Eligibility Requirements: Emergency food for the elderly, disabled, and the working poor. A two-day supply of nutritious food is provided to each household every 30 days. Discount grocery program accepts cash, check, credit, money orders or food stamps. Clothing is provided every three months to those who have lost everything due to fire or other disaster and those in financial crisis. Security deposits available for those with jobs and can pay rent but can't pay initial deposits. Utility assistance for those in financial need.

Process: Apply in person, Monday-Thursday, 9:00 a.m to 2:30 p.m. Picture ID, Social Security card, and proof of need required for food. For rental or utility assistance, call the 2nd Monday of each month (Tuesday if it is a holiday) to make an appointment. Do not leave a message—call back. Must live within Gainesville city limits. Only offered to one client at a time. Replacement identification services offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. Call 352-548-4806 for dental services. Call 352-372-8162 for vision clinic. Exams are offered every three months. Therapy offered on Tuesdays from 5:00-6:30 pm. Call the main number or walk-in. Medical advice and referral offered Tuesdays from 5:00-6:30 pm. Walk-ins welcome. GED class offered Monday through Thursdays, 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Call main number for class dates.

Appendix D

Employment Guide

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

This guide was created to assist ex-offenders who are or have been recently released from incarceration as they seek to find employment in Florida. To the best of our knowledge, the companies listed in this guide will consider hiring persons with felony records.

Although corporate addresses and phone numbers are provided, most of these companies are franchises and, as such, applications and resumes should be, whenever possible, delivered to the specific franchise from which an offender seeks employment. Such addresses could not be included here, as most corporations have many, even hundreds. A search of the local phone book or on the Internet can reveal whether the listed corporations have a franchise in a specific location. Because each franchisee can set their own employment criteria, there is no guarantee that a particular location will hire people with felony records.

Further, whenever possible, interested persons are encouraged to submit applications online at the websites provided in this guide. Many employers only accept resumes and applications in that fashion. Public libraries offer free Internet for persons who hold library cards and are generally staffed with people who can assist.

TOP CAREERS/JOBs FOR EX-OFFENDERS

1) Construction.

Many construction companies are small, which might allow applicants to share more of their interest and experience with the actual bosses, not Human Resources. Many positions require little formal education.

2) Landscaping.

These companies also tend to be small and are typically in need of assistance. In Florida, the work can be year round and they tend not to require a lot of formal education.

3) Truck Driving.

Many trucking companies hire ex-offenders, depending on how long ago the felony occurred and the type of offense. These are often high-paying jobs but do require time away from home. Many even help employees earn a Commercial Driver's License (CDL), which is required. For a list of trucking companies that hire ex-offenders, including their specific requirements regarding type of offense and time since it occurred, see <http://www.cdl101.com/trucking-companies-that-hire-felons/>

4) Fast Food.

Although they may not offer much in terms of advancement, there are a lot of jobs in the fast food industry and many companies hire ex-offenders. Most of the fast food chains are franchises, so each individual restaurant makes its own decisions on hiring.

5) Newspaper Delivery Contractor.

Most large newspapers hire contractors to deliver daily papers. The hours tend to be very early, but most do not conduct background checks on contractors. A great way to find these jobs is to use the search engine www.indeed.com, and use the city or state where you live for the "where" box and in the "what" box put Newspaper Delivery Contractor.

6) Call Centers.

Major companies like AT & T, Sprint, Verizon and FedEx operate call centers throughout the U.S. that often employ ex-offenders. These positions can be found by using the search engine www.indeed.com and typing the city or state where you live in the "where" box and call centers in the "what" box.

1417) Temp Agencies.

Although ex-offenders may not be eligible for all the jobs available, the big temp agencies typically have some positions for which someone with a felony record would be eligible. COVER LETTERS AND RESUMES

THE COVER LETTER

General Comments:

The cover letter is a courteous method of introducing yourself and your resume to the person involved with hiring at the company to which you're applying. Sometimes your package will go directly to the person making the hiring decisions and sometimes it will go to someone in a department that will sort through the applications and present those best suited for consideration to an appropriate decision-maker.

The cover letter is a personal introduction to the company, describing who you are, and specifying why you're writing to the company. It should be personally addressed to an individual so that it goes directly to a person familiar with the employment opening or who has input into the department for which you are making a general inquiry about available positions. To achieve this there is homework that needs to be done regarding the proper addressee; this effort will help ensure that your letter does not go astray. Most job listings in newspapers and on websites provide this information but if it is not provided, it is appropriate to contact the company to find out where and to whom to send application materials.

Letters need to be proofread—over and over again—preferably by more than one person, to make sure that spelling and grammar are correct and that your message is clear to the reader. The letter should leave no doubt as to who you are and why you're applying.

The cover letter should be very focused as to what specific job you're applying for, or in the case of a general inquiry, what specific job you would like to do and why. Open the reader's eyes as to what specific skills you have, your experience, and how that is related to the job you are seeking. Always use professional language, no slang, so as to be taken seriously. Let the reader know about your accomplishments, any awards or recognition you have received, and how your work experiences and accomplishments will make you a good fit for the position you seek. Research the company. Know as much as you can about the firm so you can write effectively about its products or services in the cover letter and later in person if you get an interview. This shows effort and genuine interest in being a part of the team.

SAMPLE COVER LETTER

Writing a Cover Letter

There are certain times when it is necessary to write a cover letter when applying for a job. Many classified ads, for example, include a postal box number with a request that you reply by mail. You may also find yourself needing to write to a firm that hasn't advertised. As in responding to a classified ad, you will want here also to write a cover letter requesting an interview, and attach to it a copy of your resume.

The letter should be typed. Be neat and informative, but also to the point. The cover letter is a reflection, along with your resume, of what you are like as a person. It deserves careful consideration.

The body of the letter can be divided into three parts. In the first, you make mention of the job you are applying for, and where you became aware of the opening. In the second part of the letter, you point out those aspects of your background which relate particularly to the job in question, and indicate why you want the position. The third section of the letter should request an interview and include a phone number or e-mail address where you can be reached.

If the letter is to be addressed to a personnel director or head of a department, call and ask the receptionist for the person's full name. A personal letter usually makes a better impression. Otherwise, "To Whom It May Concern" will suffice.

THE RESUME

General Comments:

The object of the resume is to get an interview. Since companies typically receive many inquiries for open positions, your resume should stand out in regard to appearance, clarity of facts, logical progression of events, and your “qualifiers,” or those things that speak to your skills and accomplishments and leave the reader desiring to bring you in for a full discussion. Resumes should be kept to one page; be clear about your facts, present them in a clear and uncluttered way. Remember, appearance counts, so although you are writing this on one piece of paper, try to use white space judiciously. Remember, you’re telling the reader why you should be hired for a specific job.

Open the resume with your personal information: name, address, email and phone number(s). List your educational experiences, including all degrees, certifications, accomplishments and awards. Provide your work history in chronological order, listing the dates of employment, skills utilized in the position, specific work-related tasks, areas of responsibility, and any awards, recognitions, promotions or other accomplishments, such as employee of the month. Try to imagine yourself in the job you’re applying for...have you presented your abilities and qualifications in such a way that you would be hired for it?

As with the cover letter, proofread your resume many times and enlist others to do this as well.’ Spelling, clarity, and choosing forceful and enlightening words to highlight your important points are very important. Focus on the business, your skills, and reasons for employment. Be sure to update your resume as you add new education, skills and other relevant experience!

Notes to Sample Resume I

Darryl Cooper spent three years, from 1998 to 2001, incarcerated in a New York State Correctional Facility. In his resume, he has learned to use his experience to his best advantage.

- 1 → Show that while in prison you've done constructive things with your time, not just "done" time. Mention any educational achievements, for example, or work experience you've had while incarcerated.
- 2 → If you've been involved in any organized prison activities or programs, list them. They help indicate to a prospective employer what you may have experienced while away in terms of personal growth and development.
- 3 → Consolidate and make use of your short-term employment experience. Four three-month painting jobs over a four-year period can be presented as "1 year's experience."
- 4 → In choosing references, select persons who can testify as to what you are like today, how you have changed, and your readiness to settle down and take on the responsibilities of a job.

Notes to Sample Resume II

Hector Diaz spent 2001-2004 incarcerated at an upstate correctional facility. His training as an asbestos remover at the prison has provided him with marketable skills that he can use now that he is being released. He has learned that the New York State Labor Department lists asbestos handling among the fastest-growing occupations in New York City. Although Hector realizes he must acknowledge his conviction when asked on his job application or during an interview if he has ever been convicted of a crime, he names the school upstate which granted him a degree without mentioning that he received the degree as a prisoner, and he lists the facility where he received his asbestos training only as "Mid-Apple C.F.," not "Mid-Apple Correctional Facility." This assures that information about his incarceration remains between him and the interviewer, not screeners or whoever else might have access to his resume. After gaining access to an interviewer, he will have the opportunity to explain his conviction and his personal growth and change while incarcerated. (For a more detailed discussion on accounting for time incarcerated, see Appendix, page 257.)

- 1 → Be sure to include all of the formal training and education you may have received, including courses in the armed forces and in prison, for example. It is to your advantage to show the prospective employer that you spent your time productively while incarcerated.
- 2 → When listing your work experience, always emphasize your responsibilities on the job, and the skills that you learned or needed to employ. This is as true for "low-level" jobs as it is for more professional ones. Make your jobs sound important. Hector was sent with fellow asbestos workers from his facility to work in non-profit and local government sites throughout the county. He makes reference to this as well as to the fact he worked as part of a team.
- 3 → Use action verbs for more effect (managed; supervised, trained, organizing, selling, etc.).

- 4 → Play up any personal data and advantages that might be useful to your job (fluent in Spanish, driver's license) or in explaining your character (basketball coach).
- 5 → It is not usually necessary to list specific references on the resume.

Notes to Sample Resume III

Jennifer Blake spent most of 2001 incarcerated on Rikers Island in New York City, convicted on a misdemeanor charge. Because she has had little formal education and no long history of job experience, Jennifer has decided to construct a skills-type resume. She will focus on the many skills she learned while being a homemaker living with a disabled grandparent (Homemaking), a volunteer health worker (Health Care), a security guard (Relating to the Public), and working as an inmate in jail. While incarcerated, she learned skills as a cook's assistant. (For a more detailed discussion on accounting for time incarcerated, see Appendix, page 257.) Many job counselors advise that it is no longer necessary to state "References available upon request," as it is self-evident.



In choosing a skills-type resume, emphasize the skills you have learned from your non-job-related experience, including volunteer work, as well as from your paid job experience. List your responsibilities and make them sound important, especially in light of your career objective.



If you have little job experience in your past, volunteer for work in the field in which you are interested. It provides you with legitimate work experience and possible contacts for paying jobs. It also gives you the opportunity to show a prospective employer that you're motivated to move ahead.



Why not consider furthering your education? Many free or low-cost courses exist throughout the city in a variety of fields, such as High School Equivalency and vocational skills. Listed on a resume, they will impress an employer and show that you are a person who wants to learn and has taken the initiative to do so.



If you didn't finish high school, omit the dates. If, however, you are asked specifically about being a high school graduate, be honest. Remember that any information on the resume can always be checked for verification by the employer.

- 5 ➔** Be sure to include all information that might be relevant to your job objective or revealing of your character. Certificates in swimming and first aid, for example, are relevant to pursuing a career in nursing. Being a basketball player at school indicates that you are skillful as a team player, competitive, and confident.

How to Use a Resume

1. Clip a copy of your resume to your job application. You can do this at a personnel office, for example, especially if the resume contains information not asked for on the application.
2. Bring copies of your resume to job interviews, and leave a copy with the interviewer.
3. Leave copies of your resume with the any job-placement agency with which you establish contact.
4. Give copies of your resume to friends, relatives, or associates, who may run across job openings from time to time and notify you of them.
5. In job hunting some people may need to construct two or more resumes to focus on different aspects of their experience. If, for example, you've had many different jobs in your work history, you may wish to emphasize some in applying for one job and others in applying for another job. You might also want to readapt your "job objective" depending on the opening for which you are applying.

THE INTERVIEW PROCESS

Personal Preparation:

Applicants who have forwarded their resume and cover letter to a firm for a position, and as a result have been contacted for an interview, should be aware that the interview is perhaps the most important event in the entire application process. This indicates that the prospective employer has a genuine interest in you and wants to meet you to make sure that what is seen on the paper matches the person who wrote it. The interviewer wants to know that this person is in every respect “normal,” cheerful, a team player, open to direction, and has genuine enthusiasm for the open position. It also is an opportunity for the prospective employer to assess your creativity, communication skills, desire to learn, and energy level.

The key here is to be prepared. Know something about the company, its services or products, especially in the area to which you’ve applied for employment. LISTEN ATTENTIVELY; ask questions if you don’t understand what the interviewer is asking. When speaking to the interviewer, don’t use slang, use the best words you have at your command, be cheerful but not silly, and look at the interviewer with complete attention. Take a deep breath and organize your thoughts, so what you say is what you mean to say. It’s important to dress appropriately; there are places like the Salvation Army that will outfit you. Call the nearest one for information. Women may apply to Dress for Success, a non-profit agency that assists women with professional work attire, you may find them in the phonebook or on the internet. Make sure your shoes are shined and that you look the part of a clean, organized person. Correct posture and a well-groomed appearance is essential.

Prepare to discuss your skill sets, education and work experience. Prepare in your mind what you want to emphasize that will tie into the requirements for the job for which you’re applying. Computer knowledge or mechanical abilities, were you a “teacher” to other workers? Did you work independently, were you a supervisor or team leader, what did your work performance reports indicate, did you receive any positive recognition, did you improve a process or method of operation? What did your last employer count on from you and did you perform?

Interview Preparation:

Below is a series of questions and comments that the interviewer is likely to ask you. Practice responding to them. It is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED that you role-play with someone so that your answers can be critiqued and you can develop confidence in your replies.

“Welcome, I want to thank you for coming in. Please sit down. May I offer you coffee or a glass of water?”

“I have looked at your application and I’m interested in moving forward, how does that sound?”

“When and what kind of work did you do last?”

“Did you enjoy the job? What did you like most about your work?”

NOTE: If you’re asked about what you liked least about the job, be careful, don’t criticize your old boss, stick to the job issues and do it in such a way that you don’t look extreme. For example, “I would have enjoyed more responsibility,” or “I feel I didn’t have the opportunity to learn all that I could have.”

“Share with me what life skills or job experiences you have that would make you a good fit for our company.”

“I’m aware of your time in corrections. I want you to know that it’s our company policy to be open to those who have served their sentences and are ready to re-enter society with a positive attitude for the future. Would you care to discuss any of that?”

“Are there any issues from your past that you care to add to this conversation?”

NOTE: Don’t lie, but say things in a way that shows you understand the situation you got involved in and now have a firm commitment to move forward. This would be a good time to mention the references (family, friends, former employers, former co-workers, prison officers, clergy, etc.) you feel might be relevant. Do not go into detail regarding why you were incarcerated, as that is not necessary. End this point on a positive note, reiterating your commitment to move on and contribute positively.

“If you’re hired here, are there any concerns you’d like me to address about making the transition from incarceration to the workforce? “Where would you like to see yourself in five years?”

“There is a probationary period of ____ months for new employees. At the end of this time, new employees receive their first evaluation. During the probationary period, your work performance will be observed and evaluated, this is standard practice. Please let us know if you have any questions about your work during this period.”

“In your own words, tell me what getting this job will mean to you.”

Please note, all interviews are different, so the list above should be taken as just a sample. Interviews tend to move in the direction that responds to answers you give to one or more questions, or in a direction that the interviewer sees as important. If you get a question that you haven’t prepared for, TAKE YOUR TIME and THINK before you speak.

Everyone who gets into an interview is a bit nervous because we want to put our best foot forward. The interviewer knows this, and it would be a plus if you can demonstrate relaxed self-

confidence so that the interviewer is pleasantly surprised about how you handle yourself, your honesty, and your friendly but not silly nature. Curiosity about the company and the work you're applying for are always welcomed by interviewers. At the end of the interview it's perfectly fine to ask about the next step, which shows eagerness and genuine desire to move forward. A parting comment of assurance to the interview is also in order, as it shows that you realize the enormity of this opportunity and you give your personal assurance that choosing you for the job will be a positive decision on the part of the company. Be sure to thank the interviewer for the opportunity! Pray before and after the interview, humbly asking God for His guidance and assistance in this process. It would be a good time to remember the words of Our Lord: "Without me you can do nothing." Good luck!
