CRITERIA

he Student Poster Session and Competition is a feature of Barry University's Community Engagement Symposium, held annually on the last Wednesday of March. The Poster Session is open to students—undergraduate and graduate—as well as faculty, staff, and community partners. However, the Poster Competition is open to undergraduates only.

The criteria for selecting prize winners (see the next page) are listed in four categories: *Content, Relevance, Visual Presentation*, and *Audio Presentation*.
